#### Geography: (2 Weeks)

Using the information you have gathered about Hersham. Design a leaflet about why you might want to live there. Definitely include photos and some fun facts! You can use these titles as a structure to help:

Page 1 - Title Page (Photos/Map of Hersham) Page 2 - Why Move to Hersham? Page 3 - General Info (Landmarks/Annual Events) Page 4 - May favourite part of Hersham? Why?

#### Science (2 Weeks)

#### Task One:

This week we would like you to think about where light comes from. Mind map as many ideas as possible showing different light sources. Can you categorise them into man-made/artificial and naturally occurring examples? Is the moon a source of light?

#### Task Two:

Find and write the definitions of the following terms:

- transparent
- translucent
- opaque

Can you find as many different objects around your house as possible to fit into each category? You may need a torch to explore if light can pass through each object (most phones have torches, but please check with an adult before using their phones!). If you do not have a torch, record your predictions - in which category do you <u>think</u> each object could be placed? Produce a table to record your findings.



### Task Three (optional):

To extend your learning further, you could explore how white light (visible light) is actually made from a spectrum of 7 colours, much like a rainbow. Your challenge is to investigate how light behaves through three different investigations. Write down any observations, thoughts and questions you may have and we look forward to hearing about your findings once we are back at school.
