Dear Parishioners, dear friends,

Near the cross of Jesus, we are told in St John's Gospel, stood His mother and the disciple whom He loved. It is an extraordinary scene of harrowing pain and yet the deepest love, it is full of suffering and yet strangely charged with power. St Maximilian Kolbe said that 'The Cross is the school of love'. It is only when we mediate on the cross, when we pray before the cross, that we begin to know what the saint of Auschwitz means.

Most of us learn how to love in our homes and through our mothers. The family might also be described as a school of love. We learn to bear with one another and forgive each other. We learn the power of love that unites and gives joy, that challenges and supports. Unlike the school of the love of the Cross of Christ it is not a perfect love, but its wonder and effectiveness are understood by us, from the earliest of years.

Today we remember our mothers, living and departed. We pray for them and give thanks for them and, if we can, spend time with them. Some of you who are reading this are those sorts of women and we are so grateful to you and send you our love and our prayers today. The gospel for this Sunday reminds us that it was Jesus Himself who said, 'And when I am lifted up from the earth I shall draw all things to myself.' May God who loved the world so much that He gave us His only Son, keep us close to the school of love at which our Heavenly Mother stands.
