We are told that the grace of God builds on our nature. The collect of today's Mass talks of our mortal frailty declaring that, without God, we can do nothing. There are times when we need all the help we can get, especially when we feel frail – physically, emotionally, morally – in ourselves. This help we call the grace of the sacraments.
