**Fr Bill writes:** Fr Ruslan and I have met to co-ordinate the handover. My last public Mass in the parish will be on Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> August and Fr Ruslan will officially take over on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> September. Please be aware that it is Fr Ruslan's intention to organise a farewell Mass in due course for me after his official installation by the Bishop as Parish Priest. Therefore there is no need for people to get together before his arrival to plan anything for me. I still have three months in Walton and there is much to do.

**John and Ola** will be departing during the weekend of 17/18<sup>th</sup> July to start a new venture in Cumbria in the north of England. There will be an opportunity to say goodbye to them during the weekend 10/11<sup>th</sup> July. The Parish is grateful for all that they have done during their time here.

**Advance Warning:** The First Communion Masses will be taking place at 2.00 pm on the first four Saturday afternoons during the first four weeks of July. On those Saturdays there will be no morning Masses though the opportunity for Confessions will continue.

With the relaxation of the pandemic restrictions **30** people are now allowed at Baptisms. The **Offertory Procession** can now take place and the priest will at Communion now say "**Body of Christ**" to which each person responds **Amen. Altar Servers** can now start to fulfil their role. However there can be no singing on the part of the Congregation and masks and social distancing regulations are still in place.

I am very grateful for the work of the stewards in ensuring that we are all safe and that social distancing is maintained as far as is possible. Without their generous help the church would not legally be able to open. It is important therefore that we show our appreciation for what they do by complying with their instructions. **It would be very helpful if some of you could help with the cleaning of benches after Mass on Sundays so that it is not left to the generous few.**

**First Communion and First Reconciliation:** I will be meeting groups of parents and children on the Sacramental Preparation Course face-to-face to introduce them to the Church and to what will happen when they Make their First Communion in July. These meetings will take start at 5.30 pm on Wednesdays and 3.30 pm on Saturdays and last no more than an hour.

## Forthcoming Feasts

## 9<sup>th</sup> June St Columba (521? - 597)



Columba (Gaelic Colm Cille) He was born in Gartan, in County Donegal, and was of royal lineage. He studied under Finnian of Moville and Finnian of Clonard. He founded monasteries at Derry, Durrow, and possibly Kells, before leaving Ireland as a missionary, “an exile for Christ.” His greatest foundation was Iona, from where he converted much of western Scotland, and his followers took the Gospel as far as northern England. He died at Iona in 597. He was renowned as a poet and scribe as well as a spiritual guide. In Gaelic literature he appears as Ireland’s most popular saint, noted for his great personal love of all creatures, both human and animal.
