19 pupils are currently identified as Disadvantaged at Cardinal Newman – this is 4.6% of pupils. 4 out of 19 disadvantaged children also have SEND.

Attendance of Pupil Premium pupils from 1/9/19-20/9/20 was 90.7% which is below the school average. Attendance of service children is 95.9% – attendance is monitored closely to ensure improvement for each individual child.

When attendance falls below the expected level, the Headteacher meets with parents on a one to one basis to offer support.

Direct support given including training for parents in Behaviour Strategies (3,2,1 Magic) in line with school policy. Children more confident and accessing the curriculum more readily as a result.
HLTA ELSA Emotional Literacy Support	£720	Emotional support to enable children to perform as well as they can in school .and on ability to concentrate. This then impacts on progress in the long term. Some of these sessions did not take place due to school closure in Spring2/Summer 1 but some were restarted with partial reopening in Summer 2
SENCO	£503,39	SENCO support for staff to provide additional advice to all Pupil Premium families (parents and children) to ensure targeted support for children’s needs resulting in accelerated progress for some children across the curriculum.
School Trip Support	£309	Financial support enabled all PP children to access opportunities which they may not have been able to access otherwise. All PP children received vouchers to put towards a trip or club. This is less than previous years as no residential trips took place
