EXPLORE

Each of us, by the way we live our lives, the way we treat others, and by our words and actions, show if we have an attitude of service.

Often, we are especially influenced by those whose actions speak powerfully of a life of service.

- Q Think of someone who impresses you deeply because of the way she/he lives.
- Q What is it that impresses you?
- Q What do you think inspires them?

REVEAL

Christians believe that the Spirit of God is active in each person and, in a special way, in the community of believers, which is the Church. It is the work of the Spirit to enable people to hear God's message and to live Jesus' way of service.

EXPLORE

Passing on messages

STANDARD INDICATOR

LEARNING INTENTION: Passing on messages.





Talk your child about messages and their experience of passing on messages. Consider some different messages and what might be the best way to pass each on, for example: a school football match has been cancelled, a birthday invitation, the birth of a baby.

SOME KEY QUESTIONS

- Q What is easy about passing messages?
- What is difficult?
- What responsibilities are involved?
- Q How do some messages make us feel?
- Q Does it make a difference how messages are passed on?

Read this story.

'Snowy, Snowy!' called Lucy. "Mummy, I can't find Snowy anywhere. She's been out all night." When Lucy came home from school, she asked, "Has Snowy come back?" "No, she hasn't," said Mum. "I'm beginning to get worried about her, cats often go off, but not for so long. What do you think we should do?" "Can we put a notice in the corner shop and tell the police?" suggested Lucy. "Good idea," said Mummy, "Ask Daddy to help you write out the notice and to phone the police." Lucy and Daddy phoned the police and wrote out a description of Snowy for the shop notice board. Next day, Lucy asked the other children at school if they had seen Snowy.

The children took the message home and asked their parents about Snowy. Two days later, Lucy was having her breakfast and feeling sad because she missed Snowy so much, when she heard the hinge of the cat flap creak. She ran to the back door and there was a bedraggled Snowy, she didn't look much like snow, she was so muddy. She made her way to her food bowl. 'Where have you been, Snowy?" asked Lucy as she cuddled her. Snowy replied with a weak meow. "How lovely to have Snowy back!" said Mummy, "We'd better send a message to everyone to tell them to stop looking because Snowy has come home."

SOME KEY QUESTIONS

- Q How did Lucy's family pass on the message that Snowy was missing?
- Who did they tell?
- What else could they have done?
- Why was it important to pass on the message that Snowy had returned?

Play a game where you pass on messages to people in your family. Maybe leave them a note, use Morse Code or send it via a paper aeroplane.

REVEAL

I can **recognise** the stories of Jesus' Resurrection. I can **retell** the story of the Resurrection.



Let's hear about the women who were told to pass on the message.


Good News Good News

Very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb where Jesus had been laid.




They found the stone covering the tomb had been rolled away, so they went in; but they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.

They stood there puzzled about this, when suddenly two men in bright shining clothes stood by them. Full of fear, the women bowed down to the ground, as the men said to them,



'The Lord Jesus is not here; he has been raised from the dead he is alive. Remember what he said to you while he was in Galilee: that he would be crucified, and three days later rise to life.'

Then the women remembered his words and returned from the tomb, and gave the message to the eleven disciples and all the rest.

- What had Jesus told them to remember?
- How do you think the eleven disciples felt when they heard the news from the women?



Show your learning...

Think about the special news the women told the disciples. What words do you think they used and how do you think they felt? Record this as a diary entry which begins with: You will never believe what happened today...

Act out the story using some of your toys as props.


LEARNING FOCUS 2:

- Q How do you think the Holy Spirit helps today?

Challenge:

Make a display on paper using the photos and their written/scribed responses using the title: *The Holy Spirit is always with us as Jesus promised.*

LEARNING FOCUS 3: The Ascension.


I can recognise the story of Ascension.

As Jesus was blessing his disciples, he left them and returned to his father in Heaven.


His disciples praised

What does this painting make you wonder about?




This painting is by an artist called Jacopo di Cione.

I can to **recognise** how the disciples changed through the power of the Holy Spirit. I can **retell** the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit.




What do you wonder about?


Looking at the picture again. Which part of the story do you think it shows. Can you see what has changed for the disciples?

They missed Jesus very much. They felt weary and lost. They couldn't get up and get on with their lives. They didn't know what to do.


They talked about their time with Jesus and wondered about his promise, 'I will not leave you alone'.

Pentecost: is a Greek word meaning the fiftieth day. At the feast of Pentecost, the Jewish people celebrated God's gift of the law, God's rules for them to help them to be happy.

The Good News is that the Holy Spirit is a helper and guide for everyone, so they can spread God's love.

What happened? Who was there? How did people feel? What do you think will happen next?



What do you wonder about the Holy Spirit?





- Why does St. Paul tell us not to be sad?







LEARNING FOCUS 6: Spreading the Word by our lives.

I can **describe** ways in which Christians spread the word of the Good News of Jesus in their lives.


The Holy Spirit helps us in our lives.

St. Paul wrote to the Christians living in Rome when they were getting ready for his visit. He was encouraging them because it was quite difficult being a Christian at that time. He told them how the Holy Spirit helps people.

SOME KEY QUESTIONS

- How can we help each other do what is right?
- How do you think people pass on the Good News in their lives? Can you name any?
- Q If we all live our lives as God wants us to, what would the world be like?



We don't always find it easy to be good or to do the right thing but, like the Christians living in Rome, we can ask the Holy Spirit to help us, so we can pass on the Good News by our kindness and goodness. We can think of people who are good and kind who show us the Good News of God's love. Let us pray....



Show your learning...

Create a poster called 'Spreading the Good News of God's Love'.

Show the ways that Christians can spread the Good News of Jesus.











RESPOND

Remember, celebrate and respond to passing on messages, and Pentecost, spreading the Gospel message through the gift of the Holy Spirit

Remember

Start the session with a moment of quiet reflection. Light a candle and make the sign of the cross. Provide your child with the opportunity to engage with questions of meaning and purpose related to the experience of *Spreading the Word*.

Ask your child if there is anything they wonder about

- The importance of messages in daily life.
- The responsibility of passing on messages.
- The new life of Jesus.
- How the Holy Spirit helps Christians.

Provide the opportunity, possibly by one of the means above, for the children to remember

- On Easter Sunday we remember that Jesus rose from the dead.
- Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit.
- On the Feast of Ascension, the Church celebrates Jesus' return to his Father in Heaven.
- What happened on the first Pentecost Day.
- Jesus has promised us new life.
- Ways of spreading the Good News about Jesus.

Rejoice

Say a prayer or sing a hymn together.

Renew

Help your child to make an individual response to what they have understood and celebrated from their own experience and the experience of the Church community.

Apply their learning

'How can I spread a word of love?'

Some suggested ideas

After a time of quiet reflection and prayer invite your child to:

 Make and decorate a book mark which has a word of love that they would like to pass on.

Finish by making the sign of the cross.
