Fr Bill writes: This will be my last comment in any official capacity in the parish. As I have been clearing out my room in the presbytery and looking at papers spanning the short time I have been here I am struck by how the parish has come together to meet the challenges of the pandemic. I encountered a feeling of insecurity and uncertainty as to the future of the parish. Through your coming together and helping to put the parish on a sustainable financial footing the Bishop felt enough confidence to send Fr Ruslan as your Parish Priest.

This gives the parish stability you have only reached the foothills of the mountain to be climbed to restore the fabric of the church building and to energise the parish to meet the needs of a rapidly changing church and society. I am confident that you will give Fr Ruslan every support and backing when he comes to serve you and I would like to thank you all for the welcome you have extended to me personally and for the co-operation in meeting the challenges of the Pandemic.

My mandate officially ends on Tuesday 31st August but I will to continue to celebrate masses in the Parish until and including Sunday 5th September. I will remember you in my prayers.

Announcements

We have now received official guidance from the Bishops' Conference with regard to services in Catholic churches. On this basis the following points need to be made for parishioners to consider and will operate from 19th July:

- The rate of infection is increasing exponentially and therefore the expectation is that all adults will be expected to wear masks in church to mitigate the spread of infection.
- All people should continue to sanitise their hands on entry to the church.
- The practice of cleaning the benches after each Mass is to continue. You are asked to help with this when you attend one of the Masses
- There will be no need to book places for Sunday Masses. You just turn up and try to take a place that is at least one metre from the person nearest to you.
- Singing is now permitted but because of the rate of infection masks should not be removed even if singing. The choir in the balcony will be exempted from this, as under current guidance ,since they are a significant distance from the rest of the congregation.

- Hymn books can be used but they will be split into two groups for use of the two Masses. They will be kept separate on the trolley and therefore each hymn book will only be used once a week at the most.
- The sign of peace will be restored but we will observe a non-contact version such as nodding or waving to people.
- With the relaxation of the guidance for indoor gatherings I would like to encourage the visiting of the housebound and sick but under strict guidance. All Eucharistic ministers who wish to take communion to the sick and housebound should attend a briefing session with Fr Bill after the Tuesday morning Mass on 20th July.
- For the time being I do not propose any changes in the procedure for collections but consideration will need to be given to how we facilitate special collections.
- Given the current rate of infection I do not propose to consider teas and coffees after Masses and will wait until the rate has declined significantly. That will be the time to outline the protocols for the safe conduct of such gatherings.

CCRS - The Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (CCRS) is beginning again in our Diocese this September. The course is designed for teachers in Catholic schools, for Catechists and for anyone who would like to grow in understanding as they live their Catholic faith. The CCRS offers a very flexible and accessible way of learning, it includes some online content and is made up of eight modules: six core and two specialist modules. Each module involves ten hours of course time and an assignment. For more information or to register your place please <u>contact our Formation Adviser</u>
