This season is dedicated to prayer and action for the protection of creation. It is time to renew our relationships with God, our Creator and with all creation, as we join together in prayer.

A novena – is a commitment to say a prayer or several prayers every day for nine days. Could you say a prayer every day to help repair the effects of climate change in our world?

Afghanistan In the tragic situation in Afghanistan, we are working to ensure the safety of our local partners and their communities. **Update:** The UN estimated that 80% of Afghans are women and children now in desperate need of humanitarian aid. CAFOD started working in Afghanistan in 1980's and a core part of their work was to with local organizations committed to improving the lives of vulnerable and marginalized people, supporting them to earn a living.

Our local councils, including Elmbridge are accepting refugees from Afghanistan. We wish our new residents a happy life.

Other parts of the world CAFOD continues to support local aid workers to deliver urgent food and water supplies to hundreds of thousands of people facing extreme hunger in Tigray in Ethiopia, South Sudan and north-east Nigeria. Please remember YEMEN. UPDATE: £500,000 has already been committed. This emergency is the direct result of the combination of Covid, climate change and protracted conflict.
