Fr Bill writes: As a consequence of the decline in the infection rate and of the rapid speed of the vaccination programme I have decided to reduce the social distancing of the seating to a minimum of 1 metre in accordance with Government guidelines. This means that those benches that have been roped of will have one bubble only sitting in the centre of the row. **Please avoid kneeling at present to ensure that social distancing is preserved.**

Funeral of Jose Odackal: Please note that the church will be closed to parishioners on Tuesday 27th April from 10.30 am to after the funeral. About 150 mourners will be arriving to pay their respects to Jose Odackal prior to her funeral, which will commence at 1.30 pm. Numbers have to be monitored and the flow of mourners controlled to ensure social distancing. This will be done by the funeral director.

First Communion and First Reconciliation: Starting on Wednesday and Saturday of the coming week I will be meeting groups of parents and children on the Sacramental Preparation Course face-to-face to introduce them to the Church and to what will happen during First Confession. These meetings will take start at 5.30 pm on Wednesdays and 3.30 pm on Saturdays and last no more than an hour.

Rosary in May: You are invited to gather and say the rosary on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Fridays from 9.00 am to 9.15 am prior to the Morning Mass will commences at 9.30 am.

In the post Easter period there will be Exposition and Confessions after the 9.30 am Mass on Saturdays.

29th April Catherine of Sienna (1347-1380)



Catherine was born in Siena and, seeking perfection, entered the Third Order of the Dominicans when she was still in her teens. In 1370 she was commanded by a vision to leave her secluded life and enter the public life of the world. She wrote letters to many major public figures and carried on a long correspondence with Pope Gregory XI, urging him to reform the clergy and the administration of the Papal States. She burned with the love of God and her neighbour. As an ambassador she brought peace and harmony between cities. She fought hard to defend the liberty and rights of the Popes and did much for the renewal of religious life. She also dictated books full of sound doctrine and spiritual inspiration. She died on 29 April 1380. In 1970 Pope Paul VI declared her a Doctor of the Church.
