My dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday the funeral rites of Fr Mario Sanderson, a priest of our diocese and sometime parish priest of Mayfield, are celebrated in the church of St Thomas of Canterbury Mayfield. Our own Molesey Mass will be at 9am on that day. Mayfield provided a palace and synod hall for archbishops of Canterbury. Dunstan famously staged there at the end of the Tenth century. Within 40 years of his death, he was canonised and widely venerated.

One hundred and fifty years later an archbishop of Canterbury was to die a martyr's death. The 'turbulent priest', Thomas Becket, was savagely killed in his cathedral by impetuous knights who thought they would please the king. Careless talk really does cost lives and Henry II lived to rue the day. Thomas of Canterbury's cult spread quicker than Dunstan's and many miracles were quickly attributed to his heavenly intercession. He was declared saint within three years of his death and a beautiful shrine erected in was Canterbury Cathedral.

At the Protestant reformation in the 1530s King Henry VIII ordered that the shrine be desecrated. Having previously honoured the martyr bishop he now despised him and his own careless talk and fickle faith meant the virtual destruction of English Catholic life and culture in the great places of pilgrimage in our land. Only the sainted King Edward at Westminster survived these vicious acts of sacrilegious vandalism.

Dunstan's dining room survives in Mayfield as the very beautiful chapel for the Catholic girls school of St Leonard's Mayfield. The Holy Child sisters, whose foundation this was, ensure that the chapel is well kept and the Blessed Sacrament is reserved there.

Fr Mario loved being parish priest of Mayfield. A convert to the Faith, he had all that sense of the Catholic history of the place and an infectious enthusiasm for the love of Jesus Christ and His Holy Church. Please say a pray for the repose his dear soul. OUR CHURCHES AFTER 19 JULY

The churches are open for private prayer during the day and are also open for Mass. All Saints is open every day from 9am to 4pm.

We need to be attentive to the lessons of safety and consideration we have lived with over the last 18 months. Things are now changing, but this needs to be a gentle process.
