
How did you celebrate Easter Sunday?

We are celebrating Jesus' resurrection.




On the next slide you will listen to a reading from the Gospel of John

A reading from the Gospel of John

On Sunday morning while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance.

She ran to Simon Peter and to Jesus' favourite disciple and said, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb! We don't know where they have put him."

Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. They ran side by side, until the other disciple ran faster than Peter and got there first. He bent over and saw the strips of linen cloth lying inside the tomb, but he did not go in.




When Simon Peter got there, he went into the tomb and saw the strips of cloth. He also saw the piece of cloth that had been used to cover Jesus' face. It was rolled up and in a place by itself.

The disciple who got there first then went into the tomb, and when he saw it, he believed.

At that time Peter and the other disciple did not know that the Scriptures said Jesus would rise to life.

Spend one minute thinking ...

How do you think Mary Magdalene and Jesus' other friends felt?

How do **you** feel when you hear this reading?

Mary Magdalene and Jesus' other friends must have felt very puzzled when they discovered that Jesus' body was not in the tomb.

They had seen him die, and they knew that his body had been placed in the tomb. They did not know what had happened to him.



Later, Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene and Jesus' other friends. They recognised him, and understood that he had risen from the dead.



Their feelings changed from confusion to great joy. They thought that they would never see Jesus again, but then they could see him again.



Jesus was raised from the dead to show us that even after death, there is eternal life. Even after death, there is life in heaven.

Think about being even happier than

is how Jesus' friends felt.


Some things are very difficult (or impossible) for us to fully understand with our human brains.

How can someone who has died live again?



It was essential for Jesus' friends to see that Jesus was raised from the dead so that they could understand that all things are possible for God. **We may not understand, but we can have faith and believe.**

In one of his letters St Paul wrote about 'The peace of God which surpasses all human understanding'.



Sometimes we cannot understand or explain God's work, but we can believe it. This is why Christians give God titles like 'Almighty'.

We can be thankful for the gift of all the important people in our lives.


We can be thankful for God's promise of an eternal life.
