**Dear Parents** 

Another busy and enjoyable week has passed in the school – Year 6 children were out at Painshill Park on Monday and I have been out and about in the classes seeing more evidence of the **outstanding learning** taking place. In Year 1, children had fun exploring "greater than and less than" with towers of Lego and were able to tell me that 93 was greater than 74. Meanwhile, at the other end of the school, Year 6 were investigating the Fibonacci Sequence and applying that learning to the natural world. It is wonderful to see the skill and professionalism of our teaching staff as they guide the children's natural curiosity and enthusiasm for learning.

My "Suggestions Box" has been well used by the children to give their ideas for how to improve our school and we are beginning to act on some of the many suggestions received from them. More skipping ropes have been bought for the children to use at playtimes and there are plans to canvass the children's ideas for school dinner menus. Other suggestions – such as banning homework and having chocolate for all school dinners – we have decided against at the moment!

Many thanks for the responses to the **parent questionnaire** which have been received so far – these are overwhelmingly positive and many of you have included thoughtful suggestions for the future too. If you have not yet had chance to respond, we have extended the deadline for a further week to ensure all parents have the chance to make their views heard. Even if you only want to agree (or disagree!) with everything on the questionnaire, without making further suggestions, it would be valuable to have as high a participation rate as possible.

As you know, October is the **month of the rosary** and Catholics are encouraged to say the prayers of the rosary daily during the Loly Rosary month of October. We have been fortunate to receive some children's rosary beads from the Catenian Rosary Society and we will be teaching the children how to use these in assemblies and class prayer times during October. Most especially, we would like the children to join in the international prayer of the rosary for the centenary of Our Lady of Fatima which takes place in October this year – more information about this next time. The Parent Prayer Group will also focus on the rosary this month, so why not come along on Thursday morning (9am – 9:20am) to join us? You are all most welcome! Finally, please be aware that **Class Masses** have returned to Cardinal Newman School! The first will be held today at 2:30pm with Year 5 Emerald Class and parents from this class have been invited. The other Class Masses for this term will be Sapphire Class (Y5) on 13<sup>th</sup> October and Garnet Class (Y6) on 17<sup>th</sup> November. We look forward to welcoming you into school for these special occasions. Our next school Mass will be on Cardinal Newman's Feast Day (Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October at 10.30am) for KS2 and all parents are warmly invited to join us in the school hall.
