ABSENCE AFTER SICKNESS/MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

A reminder to parents that if a child is sick they **must stay off school for 48 hours**. This helps to prevent the spread of any bugs to other children.

We are only able to give medicines which are prescribed by a doctor to be given 4 times

a day. The medicine must be given to the school office together with a completed Medication Request Form. A spoon should also be provided if needed.

We are continuing to remind children to wash their hands regularly to prevent the spread of coughs, colds, sore throats etc and again hope that you can support this at home as well. Thank you.
