As school life picks up apace and races towards Christmas, the festive season is in full swing at Cardinal Newman. I received a very sad email from a local resident this week which I need to share with you:

I am a resident of Colne Drive and am getting increasingly frustrated that cars are being parked all over our road to do the school pick up as it is convenient.

I pay for my parking permit which is not cheap so that I can get parked on my own road, but cannot get parked as cars are being left here.

I completely understand your lack of power in this situation but could you please at least send out a letter to highlight this to parents to avoid this so we do not have to take further action.

I'm a very very tired paramedic doing shift work and just want to be able to park my car on my own road. Coming back from a 16 hour shift today I've had to sit in my car on my road to wait for parents to get back to their cars and had abuse shouted at me by a father doing the school run which having been exhausted has put me in tears.

I live here and feel I have a right to park on my own road with my permit.

Please support us on this situation as we would be so grateful.

I have replied that I am appalled that any parent would shout abuse at anyone and have apologised profusely on behalf of our school. As a Catholic school, it is important that we behave in a respectful manner to everyone we meet and all adults in our school community need to be role models to our children. The local councils have notified us that they have alerted traffic wardens to patrol the streets surrounding the school more regularly, so please ensure you are parking safely and legally at drop off and pick up times.

Many thanks to Father Bill and all the Year 4 parents and children who joined us for the **Advent Reflection at 8:15 on Monday morning**. I'm afraid that Year 3 were rather outdone, as almost the whole of Year 4 turned up en masse for their turn at the Advent Reflection! Well done Year 4 (and families!) This coming Monday will be the turn of our **Y5 parents and children** and we hope to see very many of you in the hall at 8:15am. Y3, Y4 and all other year groups are, of course, also very welcome to come and join us for a few minutes of quiet reflection before the start of another busy December week.
