# Newsletter

It's been another exciting week at Cardinal Newman. For the School Council, the highlight was doubtless the trip to London on Tuesday (photos on the website). The children had a guided tour of the Houses of Parliament and even met local MP Dominic Raab coming out of 10 Downing Street! They observed the debate in the House of Commons from the public gallery; one child told me the following day, "They weren't very well behaved, Mrs Burnham. You wouldn't have liked it! They were shouting at each other and everything!" Not exactly how we encourage them to behave in School Council meetings! The children had a very rich learning experience and a thoroughly enjoyable trip —our thanks go to Mr Flower for organising it!

On Wednesday, some of our governors met children from Y1, Y3 and Y5 to talk about their experience of this year's "Building Learning Power" project. The children talked about the learning behaviours they have been working on: Resilience, Reciprocity, Risk-taking, Resourcefulness and Reflection. It was great to hear their examples of when they have used these behaviours to help their learning: "I didn't think I could do it and I was worried about getting it wrong, but I took a risk and tried it. I got it right!" "I found it really hard but I kept going and didn't give up. I got a sticker for being resilient." If you want to know more, the BLP characters are on the school website and of course, these learning behaviours are part of our "Celebration Certificates" for good learning too. The next BLP day is Tuesday 22nd May which will focus on Resourcefulness.

We have had some stunning Class Assemblies this week from Yellow Class and Coral Class. Our thanks especially to all the Y4 parents who made a special effort to get there on Thursday afternoon at the rescheduled time—we do appreciate your support for your children's school activities. From September, the Class Assemblies for parents will be timetabled for 9am on a Friday morning to make it a little bit easier for working parents to attend.

In their assembly, Y4 reminded us beautifully that May is the month of Mary and a time for us to focus especially on prayers to Our Lady. In our Monday assembly we talked about last weekend's Rosary on the Coast initiative which attracted around 30,000 people to say the rosary at coastal locations all around the UK. The Prayer Council will lead the rosary for our school community before school on Friday 18 May at 8:15am. Everyone is very welcome to join us for this time of quiet prayer. Next week, Fr Bill will celebrate the vigil Mass for the Feast of the Ascension in school on Wednesday 9 May at 2pm.
