Further plaudits this week go to our wonderful Parents' Association team. If you attended the Christmas Fair last Saturday, I am sure you would agree that there was a lovely community atmosphere and a wide range of stalls for adults and children to enjoy. Thanks to the hard work of our PA, we raised approximately £6000, including over £2000 on the silent auction! My thanks to everyone for their support and most especially, huge thanks to Lorraine and Krisztina and their whole team for their brilliant organisation and generous commitment of time and energy to make the whole day such a success! We are busy making plans to spend this money to benefit our children and have already agreed that the Parent Association will give £1,500 to fund some exciting events for Book Week (Spring Term 2018) including some Shakespeare "Play in a Day" opportunities which will benefit every child in the school. We are looking forward to enjoying the fruits of their labours and further details of Book Week will follow nearer the time! All good news this week, as agreement has now been reached on our School Minibus project. The Parents' Association has agreed to use the proceeds from the previous Summer Balls to fund half of the new minibus. Our thanks go to the **Ball Committees** for their enormous energy and enthusiasm to raise this very substantial amount of money through many months of hard planning and organising. We hope they will be delighted to see a tangible benefit to the school - a minibus in return for all that hard work!

Our school governors have also voted to use the "Governors' Fund" to fund half of the new minibus. Here, our thanks go to you, the parents, as the Governors' Fund is entirely dependent on parental donations. Catholic schools are traditionally "Voluntary Aided" (VA) which means that 10% of the funding comes from parental donations, rather than from the government. As we are now an "Academy" school in the Xavier Catholic Education Trust, we no longer have the tag "VA" but are still required to fund at least 10% of capital projects and therefore the Governors' Fund is as important as ever for the families of Cardinal Newman School. Following the minibus, the governors' priorities are to fund renewal of some classroom IT (interactive whiteboards and classroom computers/laptops) and to raise 10% of a proposed building project for the school hall. Next week, we are looking forward to the Y3 Christmas concert and to Christmas parties galore! Before that though, as in previous weeks, there will be the **Advent Reflection with Fr Bill in the hall on Monday morning at 8:15am.** This week, we will light the fourth Advent candle (we are looking forward to the following Sunday!) **and Year 6 will lead the readings and prayers**. Families from all year groups are warmly welcome to join us for a few minutes of quiet reflection before what will doubtless be another busy week!
