What a busy week! As the children continue the countdown to Christmas, there have been many opportunities this week for us to reflect on the meaning of the forthcoming Christmas celebrations! On Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon Years 1-3 delighted everyone with their wonderful nativity production. They worked together really well to sing, dance and narrate the Christmas story and family and friends alike enjoyed the spectacle of the gossiping donkeys, the bad King Herod, the shiniest star and of course the special baby brought by an angel from God.

Fast forward to the evenings of Wednesday and Thursday, when parents and friends of Years 4, 5 and 6 were treated to a confident and highly enjoyable Carol Concert, held at All Saints in Hershaw. The traditional lantern bearers heralded an evening of carols and readings, with all of the children involved in making the evening so memorable. Our thanks go to Fr Bill and to Fr Richard, for

allowing us to use the church as a very special setting for our reflections on “the reason for the season” and also for giving a special Advent blessing to all our families.

We raised a wonderful total of £4379, which will go towards the next phase of playground equipment for the KS1 playground.
