Dear Parents

I begin this week with hearty congratulations to the **Year 5 children and the whole Year 5 team on an outstanding performance of "Darwin Rocks" on Wednesday evening.** The production was the fruit of 4 weeks hard work by children and staff and the hall was packed with parents, grandparents and friends who came to support. I am sure that all who were there will testify that we were treated to a wonderful evening of entertainment and fun. The standard of singing, dancing and acting was very high and the children acquitted themselves amazingly well! Some of the audience feedback on the evening included: *"It's incredible that there is so much talent in just one year group."* 

"There were so many soloists – and they all sang so well." "They were all stars!"

Well done Year 5! We are all very proud of you.

As you may be aware, we had our annual **Teaching and Learning Review from the Xavier Catholic Education Trust ("the MAT") on Monday this week.** The Teaching and Learning Leads were focussing on Foundation Subjects (or specifically, subjects which are not Maths and English!) and they met with subject leaders as well as looking at books, visiting lessons and talking to pupils. Their report was very positive, drawing out the strengths the school has and recognising how leaders are working to further strengthen the broader curriculum. Some of the positive comments from the final report include:

"Well resourced and thought-through lessons";

"Careful planning promoted curiosity and independence"; "Fun and engaging manner"; "The school has continued to improve since the last T&L Review";

"Middle leaders talk articulately about their role and subject priorities. They have clear action plans."; "Senior leaders have a clear and positive impact on standards"

As we continue work on the broader curriculum, we will be looking for parental input in various forms, including a questionnaire for all parents and a small discussion group of parents to talk about the curriculum and support our work to meet the children's needs as effectively as possible. If you would be interested in joining that small group (a time commitment of perhaps 2 or 3 x 1 hour meetings), do please let the office know. On Wednesday this week, some of the school governors joined staff to hear a presentation on "Religious Education and the Catholic Life of the School" at Cardinal Newman. The presentation was led by Mrs Emma Sharp (RE Lead) and celebrated the many opportunities for development of faith and faith in action within our school. We are planning an information meeting for parents in the coming months, sharing information about the RE teaching and the school's role in supporting families in their faith – keep an eye out for the date when it is published!

Thanks to Father Bill, governors and staff were delighted to have the opportunity to pray together before Jesus present in the Blessed Sacrament. It was the first time we have had this opportunity in our school chapel and it was a very special moment of prayer for our school community – parents will have the chance to join a similar moment of adoration during the **"24 Hours" initiative on Friday 29th March.** More information to follow. We also took the opportunity to pray for the canonisation of Cardinal Newman. (There are positive moves afoot in Rome and reason to believe that Blessed John Henry Newman may soon (perhaps even this year) become Saint John Henry Newman. If you would like to join the prayer for his canonisation, the text of the standard prayer is as follows:

God our Father, you granted to your servant Blessed John Henry Newman wonderful gifts of nature and of grace, that he should be a spiritual light in the darkness of this world, an eloquent herald of the Gospel, and a devoted servant of the one Church of Christ.

For his insight into the mysteries of the kingdom, his zealous defence of the teachings of the Church, and his priestly love for each of your children, we pray that he may soon be numbered among the Saints. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen With best wishes, Catherine Burnham
