Welcome back and Happy New Year, if I haven't already managed to greet you on the gate this week! We are looking forward to a very busy **Spring Term** with lots of exciting activities planned for all of the classes. Dick Whittington has been a rich source of excellent writing opportunities this week and I have been delighted to celebrate some brilliant retelling of the story. This has also been a week for celebrating some of the "**Learning Powers**" the children have been learning:

Resilience - Y2 have been sharing with me their excellent progress in division; some great resilience has been evident in their books, supporting their learning from finding it tricky to finally "getting it!" Always great to see!

Reflective - Y3 produced some wonderful Quentin Blake art work, where the children's skills in sketching and in ink drawing were really developing. More importantly, the children's enthusiasm and enjoyment for their subject was tangible and they were able to reflect on what had made them successful this time: opportunity to practice; looking carefully at the details; having confidence that they could really do it. We look forward to seeing more superb art work as they progress!

I was delighted to hear from many of the children that they had received new and exciting books for Christmas. I am looking forward to hearing how they enjoy reading them! At a Surrey Head's Conference this week, there was some discussion of the rapidly disappearing art of reading for pleasure! In our fast-moving world, our children often don't have time (or inclination!) to lose themselves in a book — and what's more, they don't see many adults doing that either! Many parents ask us what they can do to help their child in school, so if you haven't already made a New Year's Resolution, perhaps you might consider this one:

Make time to talk to your child about what they are reading and let them see you enjoying reading

Share the funny parts, the scary parts, even the difficult or interesting words – let your children know how exciting and how useful reading is, so it isn't just a homework task, but a joy for life. As Roald Dahl's Matilda says: "The books transported her into new worlds and introduced her to amazing people who lived exciting lives." What a great gift to give our children!
