Dear Parents

Another busy week in the life of our school! Year 6 started the week with a trip to Painshill Park and their learning this week has focussed on their cross-curricular topic of "Alive." We are blessed with a very joined-up approach to curriculum planning at Cardinal Newman, so the children can make links confidently between their class texts, their outdoor learning and their learning in Maths, Science and foundation subjects.

Many of Year 5 and Year 6 have been out and about this week looking at where they may go on to for secondary school. It is an exciting time for them and their families and we know that wherever they decide to go on to, they will be well prepared for the learning journey ahead of them.

Meanwhile the youngest members of our school family experienced their first school

assembly on Wednesday. Many of their parents and grandparents attended a short "Welcome Assembly" where the children of Red and Orange Classes were welcomed into the school by the older children. There were lots of smiley faces, while tears came only from the parents' side of the room! We look forward to welcoming our Reception children into our whole school collective worship from Monday. As you know, our school "feast day" – the feast of Blessed John Henry Newman – is celebrated on Tuesday 9 October. The 9th October is the day when John Henry Newman was officially received into the Catholic Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi (having previously been an Anglican clergyman). This year, Fr Bill is celebrating Mass for the feast day on the afternoon before (Monday 8th at 2pm) – this is the vigil Mass (rather like a Saturday evening vigil Mass for a Sunday) and the whole school will be participating in the Mass together. Sadly we are unable to invite parents to attend on this occasion as there is not space in the school hall, but we hope you will be with us in spirit and in prayer. The children are invited to wear their house colours on Tuesday 9th and to bring a donation of £1 towards a new school banner. Looking ahead to November, we are beginning to plan a very exciting "Peace Project" to commemorate the signing of the Armistice agreement in November 1918. We hope to give every child the opportunity to participate in a "tile-painting" workshop to create a tile which will go together with tiles from children across the different classes to create a permanent display at the front of the school. There will be more details forthcoming as the project takes shape. As you probably know, there were 117 young men from Hersham who lost their lives in the WW1 and we are thinking about ways we might commemorate them specifically. It would be great to hear about any personal connections with the families of these individuals – do contact the school office if one of them is in some way related to you – or if you have any other connections we might share with the children.

On Friday, our support staff will be working with others from the Xavier Catholic Education Trust (XCET) to complete training on Effective Teaching and Learning, while teaching staff will be working on Assessment and on Foundation Subject knowledge with their fellow XCET teachers. It is a useful opportunity for staff to network and share best practice, in order to support the best learning outcomes for our children. I hope some of you might be able to take the opportunity of the INSET "long weekend" to enjoy some additional family time together.

Finally just an update on "the Galleon" – it is still coming but installation has been delayed by our suppliers. We hope the work will start by the end of next week, so watch this space!
