- The area around the fence gates has been a little bit congested at home time. Please could KS2 parents stand well back from the gate so that the children can see their parents more easily? We have plenty of space in the playground, so why not agree with your child that you will always stand "by the hopscotch" or "by the snake" or "by the adventure playground" and then they will know where to head for to find you when coming out.
- Next week Reception parents will be going "through the fence" to drop and collect their children. We would be grateful if parents from Y1-Y6 would remain behind the fence (as this week) so as not to crowd our newest starters.

Please extend a big Cardinal Newman welcome to all our new starters, both in YR and higher up the school. You will have seen lots of new faces on the playground this week, both new members of staff and new children. I know you will be very friendly and welcoming, helping them to quickly feel a part of our wonderful school community.
