## PUPIL PREMIUM - INCOME/EXPENDITURE BREAKDOWN Summer 2018

## Context of Pupil Premium Children at Cardinal Newman Catholic Primary:

19 pupils are identified as Pupil Premium at Cardinal Newman – this is 3%, which is low compared with national average, but numbers are increasing. Of these, 3 are service children, 6 are Ever 6 and 10 are currently eligible for Free School Meals. 4 out of 19 PP children also have SEND.

Attendance of PP pupils is 93.4% which is the lowest cohort in the school – attendance is monitored closely to ensure improvement for each individual child.

Home-School Link Worker support	£3900	Positive relationships developed with specific children and their families to enable the children to succeed in school. This
1.5 days per week summer term		increased parental engagement including attendance at Parents Evenings and school events to create a sustainable impact for families.
ELSA Support 36 sessions	£720	Emotional support to enable children to perform as well as they can in school. One PP child now has increased friendship group and displays greater confidence. One child with safeguarding concerns has been supported and one year 6 pupil with anxieties about transition to secondary.
SENCO time	£200	SENCO support for staff to provide additional advice to all Pupil Premium families (parents and children) to ensure targeted support for children's needs resulting in accelerated progress for some children across the curriculum.
Wrap around care support	£112.50	Breakfast / after school club provision for PP child to support family needs.
School trips support	£53.50	Financial support enabled all PP children to access opportunities which they may not have been able to access otherwise. Trips paid for during this term have included trips to Hampton Court, Brooklands Museum and Hobbledown Farm. All PP children received vouchers to put towards a trip or club and some were supported further as required (e.g. with residential costs).
School clubs support	£580	Financial support in the form of vouchers or other support has been offered to all PP pupils to encourage them to attend clubs. These have funded Gymnastics, football, Fun with Fabrics and Cooking clubs. There has been an increase in the uptake of school clubs by PP pupils in the summer term.
