EYFS	Supporting children to: Talk about past and present events in their own lives and the lives of people around them. Understand vocabulary such as how, why, because, find out, I wonder what/if/when/why? Use STEM sentences to support articulation of ideas such as; I can see, I saw, same, different, similar, change, explain Compare and contrast characters from stories including figures from the past. Recognise that familiar events can be represented in different ways e.g. photos, videos, mementos such as saved birthday cards		Providing children with: Opportunities to look at artefacts and sources related to their lives but from the past. Hooks and starting points to explore the past e.g. old telephones, typewriters, black and white pictures Opportunities for children to explore their own living memory and experiences from their childhood and before they were born utilizing parents as an important tool in this process Opportunities to learn about people and stories from the past linked to planned learning opportunities as well as responding to the interests of the children Opportunities to explore traditions and past events across the year.
