Financial Support

We are conscious of families' ever-changing financial circumstances in the current economic climate. Throughout this challenging period, the school have been working hard to support the vulnerable families we know about – those who are temporarily self-isolating / shielding and those in temporary

financial difficulty, as well as the children who usually qualify for Pupil Premium. We have regularly delivered fresh and long-life food, shopping vouchers and activity packs to our families, as well as supporting access to computers, books and printing as needed. This week, a letter about support for school uniform purchases came out from an Elmbridge charity and can be found attached.

As we prepare to close for the summer holidays, with the backdrop of daily news announcements of job cuts, we are reaching out to any other families in our community who may be in need at the moment. **Please make us aware if there is more we can do to help you financially:** the school has access to shopping vouchers for Sainsburys and Morrisons via the diocese, as well as Foodbank vouchers and other support as needed. Any of us can be financially vulnerable for a short while in the current climate and the school will help if we can – please get in touch with Mrs Burnham or Mr Flower via the school office.

Dates for 2020-21

At this time of year, we generally try to send out dates for the whole of the academic year. At the moment, it is very difficult for us to be sure which regular events we will be able to hold, so we are publishing only a condensed list of events for the first half of the Autumn Term, along with the term dates. We will keep the list under constant review and will update you as soon as we have more information.

Arrangements for September

Following last week's new guidance, the school has put together a comprehensive risk assessment for September reopening, in line with the recommendations from Public Health England. This has been approved by the Xavier Directors and the final details will be shared fully with parents early next week, following scrutiny by the Chair of Governors and local board. Thank you for your patience while we put the correct procedures in place.

Please be reassured that we plan to have all children back in school in class bubbles and plan to have Breakfast and After-School Club running as normal. There will be some minor adjustments to start and finish times and to break and lunchtime arrangements, but we intend to have as little disruption as possible to our usual routines in September, while still keeping the physical safety and emotional wellbeing of our community at the forefront of all our decision-making.

School reports for all children have been sent out this week. Reports for children who are currently at home were sent yesterday by first class post, while reports for children currently in school were handed out to the oldest sibling today. The reports were accompanied by a covering letter explaining the quite unique context of this year's reports!

Year 6 Leavers

Our very special cohort of Year 6 Leavers will return to Cardinal Newman on Monday for their final week of primary school. We are looking forward to welcoming them back and to celebrating with them as they prepare to move on to secondary school in September; our Year 6 pupils this year are going on to Salesians, to Three Rivers, to Esher High, to Heathside and to Wishmore Cross.

We wish all of them every success and happiness in the future. We know that they will leave Cardinal Newman with the confidence to shine their light at secondary school, using their skills and talents to support others and to become the very best version of themselves.
