Daily Essential Tasks:

- I Can Maths (1 test weekly)

Writing Tasks based on books read:

(Please complete 1 or 2 of the following for each book you read – each piece of writing should be around 1 A4 page)

- Letter of complaint to the author about why the ending should be different
- As a character, retell in a letter the events of a chapter to another character
- Write a 'prequel' chapter
- Compare and contrast the main character from beginning of book to end
- Rewrite a section of the story from the point of view of the villain or other character
- 'If I were the main character, I would.....'-discuss how you would act differently and why
- Your choice of writing task based on your book

Topic Projects:

- Research a famous Viking. Create a 2 page biography about them. You could include the following subheadings-Introduction, early life, main achievements, interesting facts, why they are famous
- Research how Vikings invaded Britain and create a piece of work of your choice to show your learning-it could be a model, piece of art, song, poem, comic, story etc
- Watch the 'Saga of Bjorn' (<https://www.literacysshed.com/the-myths-and-legends-shed.html>). Write a diary recounting each of his attempts to reach Valhalla through honourable battle. Make sure you include a variety of descriptions, adverbials and Bjorn's feelings in each attempt.
- Pick any topic that is of interest to you (that is age appropriate) and prepare something to share when coming back to school (does not have to be a presentation, can be a poster, small booklet, artwork, writing, pictures etc)
- Create a piece of work that explores 'Love for the world God created'. It can be in any format you wish but focus on the wonders of the world gifted to us by God and how we can look after it.
